Note from the Editor

Hello everyone, and welcome to the Summer 2023 newsletter. I'm writing this on the evening of the Summer Solstice, and what a scorcher it has been. I hope you and your hounds have been enjoying the longest day, but I suspect much of will have been trying to keep your dogs inside, in the shade, or keeping cool for either an early morning or late evening slow walk. Having a hot day is one way to make sure many of us were up at dawn!

We remind owners every summer about the common sense ways to help keep your dogs healthy. Please don't walk your dog during the heat of the day, remember the test to put the back of your hand onto the tarmac, if it's too hot to hold there for 5 seconds then it is way to hot to walk your dog. The pads of their feet are very sensitive, and will burn very easily. Your dog will not die from missing a walk, but if heatstroke kicks in, there could be the possibility that walking your dog could make it very ill, or worse, during extreme weather.

Hopefully most of our fury friends will be happy to spend the daytime sleeping. A cold wet towel placed over them could help (don't let it warm up with their body heat), and though dogs don't sweat to cool down, a fan can help lower the general temperature in the room making it more comfortable. Our greyhound used to love to sit in the river on hot days, Redbridge in Costessey being his



favourite spot once everyone had gone home for the day.

In memory - Todd (Watch the Black) 20.10.2010 - 23.03.2023

Of course we love all our dogs but Todd will always be my dog of a lifetime. Not just because he was such a good boy, but for the path my life took once he was in it. I owe him so much. He is completely irreplaceable and quite simply the BEST thing that ever happened to us.

From the very first day he came into our lives he never put a paw wrong. Unfailingly polite, gentle and kind. He was never any trouble, never made any noise and spent a good portion



of his time snoozing. It always surprised us when people commented on how big he was as such was his nature to just be present in the quietest, most respectful way, that you just forgot. Benji seems far bigger in comparison!

We adopted Todd when he was 6 years old. He was a big, middle aged, black male greyhound who'd broken his right hock racing, been rehomed for a few years and then returned when they split up. He wasn't at the top of most prospective adopters' wish lists but as he was good with small children and small dogs he went straight to the top of ours. A gentleman from the very first minute he walked through the door, we just couldn't believe our luck and fell head over heels with him and the wonderful world of greyhounds.

It soon became apparent that he was far too special to keep to ourselves so we got him assessed as a Pets As Therapy dog and well, the rest is history. It's probably easier to say what he hasn't done. There's all the children who've grown up reading to him, cuddling him and crying into his fur. He's worked with child psychologists treating dog phobic children, helped bereaved children with Nelson's Journey, visited care homes, libraries, department stores, preschools and been instrumental in flying the flag for greyhounds. He's had a bloody good nap over most of Norfolk and gently given the 'paw of more' to anyone who stopped stroking him. He's been a rock and best friend to our other dogs and all the foster dogs and friends dogs that have ever stayed with us.

Contemplating life without him is unthinkable but we are thankful for every single day and memory. If you ever met and loved Todd or have been following him through his PAT career, please do him this one favour. If you ever decide to get a dog, please consider a greyhound. Please consider an older greyhound. It's not about how long you have with them, but about how you will change their life and yours beyond measure.
