
#### Note from the Editor

Can Christmas only be just round the corner, where has the year gone? I don't know about you, but I don't like these long dark evenings and can't wait for them to start getting shorter again seems no sooner have I taken JJ and Summer for their morning walk it's time to go out again in the afternoon. When I get to this time of the year, I reflect on how the year has been. Rehoming has been very slow throughout but has picked up in the last couple of months. We normally rehome around 100 greyhounds every year, but this year have barely rehomed 60 dogs. We have a full kennel and 32 dogs waiting to come into the kennels.

Our supporters have been very generous with their donations and with a couple of very generous legacies and with money given by the GBGB (Greyhound Board of Great Britain) every time we rehome a dog we receive £400 towards their kennelling costs and £1000 to help with the cost of fracture repairs and this helps to keep our funds in a healthy state.

This year saw us saying "goodbye" to Steph and "welcome" to Dana, Alex, Emma and Ash. The extra Staff help to ensure there are always two people working on any one day. Many of you will know them already, from their time as volunteers.

The Fund-Raising Committee has been busy during the year attending Fetes, Carnivals and Dog Shows to raise awareness of greyhounds as pets. They always welcome new members to join them. The final event of the year is the Christmas Fayre at Taverham Village Sandy Lane on Saturday 9th December at 12md we look forward to seeing you there.

Wishing everyone and all their hounds a very happy Christmas and a healthy 2024.

### Fundraising update




All profits from both will be coming to Yarmouth Greyhound Homefinders.

### Easy to make Christmas dog treats

#### **Ingredients**

I egg

170g of boiled chicken breast or turkey

100g of cooked plain rice

1/4 pint of chicken stock with no added salt

680g plain flour (you may need less flour than this recipe states for the right consistency)

#### **Utensils**

- Blender or food processor
- Cookie cutters or a skilled, steady hand and a toothpick
- Rolling pin
- Baking paper
- Baking tray



#### Instructions

Preheat oven to 180 degrees and line your baking tray with baking paper.

Add the boiled chicken breast, cooked rice and chicken stock to your blender. Blitz until it's nice and smooth.

Transfer the mixture to a bowl and add in the egg and flour. Mix well until the ingredients are all combined and resemble a dough-like consistency.

Place your dough on a clean surface dusted in flour and knead it until it's no longer sticky. Once ready, roll your dough out and cut our your festive shapes using a cookie cutter.

Place your cookies on a baking tray and bake for 25 - 30 minutes. Finally, let them cool before feeding them to your dog.
